From the South:

Take I-39 north toward Rockford. Take exit 59A to merge onto I-80 East toward Chicago. Take exit 90 onto IL-23 toward Ottawa. Turn left onto Lafayette St. Go to 113 E. Lafayette St. across from the Reddick mansion and park, site of the 1858 Lincoln Douglas debate.

Denise Arzberger Double Walled Illusions

This eye-catching study in contrasts begins with a 2/2 twill base. Black spokes and natural weavers form the inside wall; natural spokes and black weavers frame a section of striking triple twining on the outer wall. Top this beautiful basket off with a beautiful, stationary forged handle.



Dimensions: 9" x 9" x 6"

Ability: Intermediate Level

Anneliese Gerbert Alcohol Ink Gourd

I will demonstrate various alcohol ink techniques that students can test on gourd pieces. The gourd will be rimmed with seagrass or Danish cord and embellished with beads.



Dimensions: size of gourd

Wear an old shirt, smock, or apron

Pam Hermann Antler Bowl-lievable

Starting with a pre-drilled and ribbed shed antler, students will weave with reed, cedar, sea grass and a variety of natural materials and leather. Hands on drilling demo will be a part of the class. Lots of color choices available. You will finish 1-2 sections in class and have materials and 'know-how' to complete the rest on your own. experienced and fast weavers often finish in class - or close to!



Dimensions: 12" 16" diameter 2" - 5" high

Denise Arzberger Market Basket with Forged Swing Handle

Natural and dyed spokes set off the colorful twined accent in this functional market basket. Students will have a choice of colors. Emphasis is on shaping the basket to fit the striking forged swing handles



Dimensions: 15" x 10" x 7"

Ability Level: All levels

Faux Raku Gourd

Students will create a faux finish on the gourd using pigment powders. The gourd will be rimmed with round reed and other material can be woven into the gourd.



Dimensions: size of gourd

Note: Bring a water container for soaking reed Wear an old shirt, smock, or apron

Pam Hermann Abalone and Cedar

Students will learn traditional Haida weave techniques and designs using finely, hand-prepared Alaskan yellow and western red cedar from Thome Bay, AK. Beautiful, large abalone specimens are included. You will learn square to round start, adding warp (spokes) and a sweet border at the top. A large selection of beads available to add an extra sparkle to your treasure! Twining experience is a MUST. Waxed linen twining experience is a greta base to learn from. Harvest and preparation will be discussed. Materials will be finely prepared and may allow some chance to experience fine tuning.

4.5" - 5.5"W X 7" L X 1.75-2.5"H depending on the shell chosen.
