Weaving Times

Starved Rock—June 10, 2013

The Basket

This year's Starved Rock basket is *Lozenge* and it has been created by Linda Hinklemann of Oregon, IL.

This basket is 6" tall x 12" across the top and is woven over a bowl in 2/2 twill and plain weave in flat oval natural and dyed reed with a wooden base.

There will be an assortment of dyed reed to choose from on that day.



Lozenge Basket

The **complete kit** includes a 6" single slot wooden base, a bowl that will be used as a mold, waxed linen to tie the base onto the mold, 3 mm cane, 3/16 flat oval spokes, #3 round reed and seagrass for filler. The cost for a **complete kit is \$35.00**.

Partial kits will also be available for **\$15.00**. The partial kit includes the 6" wooden base, bowl, waxed linen, dyed reed, seagrass, and 3 mm cane.

Measurements for the additional reed needed:

Stakes:	7mm FF N	60 @ 9"
Rim Row:		1 @ 42"
Twining:	#3 round N	8 @ 40"
Weavers	<i>3/16" FO N</i>	40 feet
Rims:	1/2" FO N	<i>1</i> @ 41" + 1 @ 39"

About Our Vendor

Linda Hinkelmann wove her first basket in 1989 from a kit that she bought because "I can do that!" She hid it in the basement so no one would see it. After many hours of practice, some classes with more experienced weavers, and joining LLBWA, she opened her own shop, *Basket Beginnings*, in Oregon, IL in 2006. She displayed her first basket so that new students could see that there is always room for improvement.

In her shop, she wove and taught from beginners to more advanced weavers. Her classes ranged from home school students and scouts to Red Hat Ladies. Chair caning has become her mainstay due to the passing of a local chair caner.

Due to the shortage of reed and the birth of her first granddaughter, Linda closed the shop in Oregon and moved her supplies and baskets back home where she will cane chairs, stools, and continue to weave baskets.

She is scheduled to teach at a private school in Dixon for the spring quarter.



Directions

I-39 southbound: South to I-80 east (exit #59). Go 2 miles to exit #81 (Rt. 178, Utica). Go south (right) 3 miles on Rt. 178 and follow the signs into the Park.

I-39 northbound: North to Exit #48 (Tonica exit). Go east (right) for approximately 5 miles to the T-intersection, which is Rt. 178. Go north (left) for approximately 5 miles and follow the signs into the Park.

I-80 Eastbound and Westbound: Get off at exit #81 (Rt.178, Utica). Go south 3 miles on Rt. 178 and follow the signs into the Park.
