Registration Information

We have eight outstanding teachers offering Friday evening classes, and all-day classes on Saturday and Sunday. There is something for everyone and all weaving levels.

Before you register, please read the class descriptions carefully and pay attention to days, times and weaving levels when making your selections. Regular classes range from six to eight hours.

Your class selections must be postmarked no later than June 1st to be considered as a first day registration. Many classes will fill on the first day so don't delay. Please read and follow all the instructions carefully on the registration form.

You must be a LLBWA member to register. If you are not currently a member, it's not too late to join. Simply enclose a check for \$15 for membership made payable to LLBWA, along with the completed membership form.

Please, read and follow all the instructions carefully on the registration form and list all classes in order of preference by day.

Registration is \$45 for one day (Saturday or Sunday) and \$70 for both Saturday and Sunday. There is not an additional registration fee for Friday night classes.

Meals are not included in the registration fee. Meals will be available at the facility but must be pre-ordered

and pre-paid. Meal information will be forthcoming with your class assignment & confirmation packet.

You will receive a class assignment confirmation packet sometime after June 7th. The fees for your classes, meals, & additional kit orders must be returned by July 15th.

Advanced:

Mastered all basic and intermediate skills for materials and techniques used. This class is more challenging.

All Levels:

Classes offered to all student skill levels from Beginner to Advanced.



Friday Night Classes

Corner Wastebasket

Instructor: Julie Kleinrath
Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$55

Description:

Woven on our corner wood base, choose between Black Walnut or Cherry Veneer. Two different twill designs are available to weave. Choose from a Tractor or Red or Blue Truck. Basket finished with 3 ball feet.

Dimensions: 10" wide x 13½" high



Ribbies

Instructor: Nancy Matthews
Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: All levels
Class Fee: \$18

Description:

Ribbies make a wonderful holiday ornament or larger miniature rib basket. Woven with natural and your choice of dyed cane or 3mm reed. A variety of colors will be available. Start with a frame with ribs already glued in place or from the beginning or one of each. Kit contains materials for two Ribbies, one will be completed in class, the other will be partially completed.

Dimensions: 3" diameter x 2" deep (without handle)



Little Warrior

Instructor: Pam Talsky
Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$35

Description:

Learn the joy of weaving with hand harvested and prepared western red and Alaskan yellow cedar bark gathered by the instructor from Thorne Bay Alaska! With this basket you will learn traditional Haida techniques for preparation and weaving with cedar. Special focus is placed on the unique style Haida twining and adding in of weavers. Plaited weaving with a reverse of direction makes the arrows of the warrior. Beads are added for his spirit.

Dimensions: 1½" square at the base x 3½" high



Willow Winds

Instructor: Marilyn Wald
Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$33

Description:

Shaping is the key to success with Willow Winds. Students will shape their basket using various techniques taught in class. The basket will be woven using natural reed and students will be taught how to achieve the desired color of their choice. The basket uses a wooden base for the beginning and the rim is made of twigs and lashed with dyed cane.

Dimensions: 33" circumference x 8" high



Friday Night Classes

Shadow Weave Basket

Instructor: Cherilyn Braun-Fontana
Class Length: Friday night—3 to 4 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$35

Description:

This round basket is woven in 3-rod wale with step-ups on a grooved wood base. The walls are a double twill weave, creating the shadow effect, then end in more 3-rod wale. An insert handle is added and it is all held together with a regular lashed rim. Some students may not complete rim in class.

Dimensions: 5.25" diameter, 8.25" tall



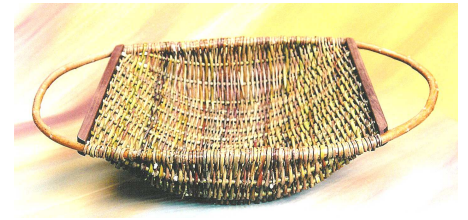
Willow Sieve

Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: All levels
Class Fee: \$25

Description:

This is a basket for the beginner in willow. Easy in construction, easy to weave, many variations in size are possible with this type of construction. An excellent basket to experience that first time "feel of willow."

Dimensions: 11" long x 9" wide x 2 1/2" high



Small Hen Basket

Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: Beginning
Class Fee: \$95

Description:

The small hen basket is a classic Jill Choate basket but a smaller version made easier. Ribs are already inserted in this rendition so that you learn all the skills in half the time. Jill shares all her tricks of the trade as they pertain to shaping, color combinations, and twined techniques on rib constructed basketry.

Dimensions: 6" x 6"



Black Ash Bracelets

Instructor: JoAnn Kelly Catsos
Class Length: Friday night—4 hours
Weaving Level: All
Class Fee: \$50

Description:

Weave with precisely prepared black ash splint over adjustable aluminum bracelet blanks and create 3 different bracelets. Learn to weave 2 sizes of twill designs as well as a braid. Many color choices available.

Dimensions: 1/2" wide and 1" wide

Cathy's Bowl

Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$49



Description:

Woven on a slotted wood base, this basket includes randing, 3-rod wale, double strand 3-rod wale, twining with contrasting elements, and a very unique Herringbone Rim.

Dimensions: 9" diameter x 4½" tall

Willowglen Gathering Basket

Instructor: Jo Campbell-Amsler
Class Length: Saturday — 8 hours
Weaving Level: All Levels
Class Fee: \$45

Description:

Using willow and rib-style techniques, a melon shaped basket designed for Willowglen Nursery will be woven in class. It is a lovely oval shape that is very useful for gathering from the garden and can be made later in a variety of sizes for various uses. Basic skills and shaping with ribs will be focused on along with discussion on gathering and preparing willow for use in basketry.

Dimensions: 15" long x 9" wide x 7" high (13" high with handle)



Double Dog Leg

Instructor: Jill Choate
Class Length: Saturday — 8 hours
Weaving Level: Advanced
Class Fee: \$125

Description:

The latest technique from Jill Choate's work bench. The Double Dog Leg is a zig zag pattern that happens as a result of a new slipped stitch technique inspired by African baskets. This is one that you won't want to miss out on.

Dimensions: 8" x 14"



Small Elegance

Instructor: JoAnn Kelly Catsos
Class Length: Saturday — 8 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate/Advanced (twill experience required)
Class Fee: \$59

Description:

Inspired by the quatrefoil twill found in fancy Shaker baskets, this cathead bowl is woven of finely prepared black ash splint over a wooden mushroom mold. The quatrefoil twill pattern is striking due to the dark heartwood stakes and white sapwood weavers. The maple rims are single lashed.

Dimensions: 6" diameter x 2½" deep

Little Twill Mitten

Instructor: Julie Kleinrath
Class Length: Saturday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$45

Description:

Woven on our assembled flat back wood base in a twill design. Choose Navy with Blueberry Pottery or Hunter Green with Pinecone Pottery. Students choose to weave from a grid or written instructions.

Dimensions: 10" long x 5½" wide x 9½" high to the top/handle



Buffalo Basket

Instructor: Nancy Matthews
Class Length: Saturday — 8 hours
Weaving Level: All Levels
Class Fee: \$60

Description:

The hand carved cedar handle is the focal point of this large rib basket. Since each handle is unique, each basket will also have a unique shape. It is woven with natural and dyed reed and sea grass. Rib placement and filling in techniques will be taught. The basket will not be completed in class, but the student will have all the necessary skills to finish it.

Beach Tote

Description:

An awesome basket for taking all the necessities to the beach or office, party, convention. The flexible rim makes it easy to fit behind a car seat, even if you wish to lie back! The 3/3 twill is a joy to weave and top it off with a great border and the leather straps that just get better with each time you grab and go — which is sure to become a daily event!

Dimensions: 18" long x 10" wide x 14" high



Blackberry Ridge

Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$64

Description:

Blackberry Ridge is a stately basket. The arrow design is repeated 3 times through out the weaving pattern. Reed spokes will be dyed a deep berry red, almost black. Wooden base is the beginning for Blackberry Ridge and the ending has 2 beautiful oak Nantucket Style handles. Shaping while concentrating on a design pattern will be the challenge for students making this basket. Students may alter the pattern a little if desired.

Dimensions: 44" circumference x 8" high



Sunday Classes

Suzanne's Mail Basket

Instructor: Cherilyn Braun-Fontana
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$46

Description:

Designed for a mail basket, but also a perfect bread basket size, this oblong basket begins on a grooved wooden base. Techniques include overlays, randing, double strand 3-rod wale with step-ups, and a colorful wrapped and lashed rim treatment.

Dimensions: 14" long x 7" wide x 4½" tall



Harvest Pouch

Instructor: Jo Campbell-Amsler
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$35

Description:

While weaving this flat backed pouch, students will learn how to make a "D-frame" of willow, how to shape the ribs to create a pleasing pouch shape, work with the concept of "turn-backs" to create an even line in the weave and as always, practice the skill of weaving with willow. A corded leather strap makes this the perfect pouch for gathering wild berries, mushrooms, nuts and whatever else is gathered along the way.

Wall Pocket with Ribs

Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Beginner
Class Fee: \$110

Description:

The wall pocket basket is a classic Jill Choate basket made easy for a six hour class with ribs already inserted and woven in. Jill shares all her tricks of the trade as they pertain to shaping, color combinations, and twined techniques on a rib constructed basket.

Dimensions: 12" long x 6" wide



Spiral Staircase

Instructor: JoAnn Kelly Catsos
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$49

Description:

Students will weave with precisely prepared black ash splint over a wooden mold to create this basket inspired by a graceful, winding wooden staircase. The twill pattern is visible due to darker hardwood stakes and lighter sapwood weavers. Maple rims and an unusual diagonal maple handle complete this little beauty.

Dimensions: 4¼" diameter x 1¾" deep (without handle)



Sunday Classes

Country Pumpkin Basket

Instructor: Julie Kleinrath
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: Intermediate
Class Fee: \$45

Description:

Woven on an oval wood base, this basket is a bit of a shaping challenge. The lower and upper bands of color are green and black, the arrow twill design is surrounded by pumpkin colored chain wale. Finished with hand made handles and a hand painted pumpkin.

Dimensions: 10½" long x 8" wide x 7½" high (9½" high to top of handle)



Little Sweetheart

Instructor: Nancy Matthews
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: All Levels
Class Fee: \$27

Description:

This is a good beginner rib basket. It is constructed on two heart shaped hoops. Ribs naturally follow the shape of the hoops. Dyed oval/oval ribs add interest. Stripes help camouflage the addition of secondary ribs. Little or no filling in will be required.

Dimensions: 8" long x 8" wide x 7" high



Off the Wall

Instructor: Pam Talsky
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: All Levels
Class Fee: \$50

Description:

This is an Alaskan cedar burl and pine needle dish. Learn the joy and art of coiling with specially prepared pine needles to create a lovely dish with a handle/hanger woven in. Hang your art piece when you are not using it!

Dimensions: 6" long x 4" wide x 1¼" high



Heart of Country

Instructor: Marilyn Wald
Class Length: Sunday — 6 hours
Weaving Level: All Levels with prior weaving experience
Class Fee: \$45

Description:

Baskets are the Heart of Country. This basket has a vintage basket hand-painted by Nancy Parker for each side of the basket. A 10 x 20 D handle is used as the basis to create the basket. Traditional weaving methods are used in creating Heart of Country. Round reed is used for the very top of the basket woven in an over and under fashion. Shaping is a key to this basket and students will learn new techniques for working with round reed.

Dimensions: 10" long x 8" wide x 13" high



Teacher Bios



Cherilyn Braun-Fontana - Dexter, MI

Cherilyn teaches at her studio in Dexter, MI (www.basketweaving.biz), and for local and state basketry groups. 2007 was her first year teaching at the Stowe Basketry Festival in Vermont. She is the President and Co-founder of the Ann Arbor Area Weavers' Guild and was invited to teach basket weaving techniques for a special Fiber Arts Series at Washtenaw Community College. A winner of several awards, Cherilyn gets great satisfaction from sharing her knowledge of basket weaving with others.

Jo Campbell-Amsler - Monticello, IA

Jo has been using willow in her basketry work for the past twenty-five years and specializes in using rib-style techniques. She works from her studio in Monticello, IA, teaching her craft and selling her pieces throughout the United States. While most of her baskets are functional, she is non-traditional in her approach to using found objects from nature in her work and likes to push the willow to form some sculptural aspects, often creating "one-of-a-kind" baskets.

Jill Choate - Trapper Creek, AK

Jill made her way to Alaska in 1984, where she divides her day between mushing her sled dogs and creating some exceptional basketry. Jill's work has been exhibited in several national exhibitions. Her basketry has been included in the book "Baskets a Book for Makers and Collectors" and awarded best in round reed construction for her submission "Hornocopia" in the Northeast Basketmakers and Guilford Handcraft Center exhibit entitled "Baskets 2002: New Perspectives on an Ancient Tradition". She has been the Keynote speaker at the Indiana Basketmakers Convention and regularly tours the Lower-48 states during the summer months.

JoAnn Kelly Catsos - Ashley Falls, MA

JoAnn Kelly Catsos is a black ash splint basketmaker and teacher from MA. She and her husband Steve process the splint and make all of the molds, handles and rims needed for the baskets. Weaving for 24 years, JoAnn teaches and exhibits nationally. Her award-winning baskets are in private and public collections and many publications, including "500 Baskets". JoAnn is a recipient of the Certificate of Excellence in Basketmaking from the Handweavers Guild of America.

Julie Kleinrath - Lebanon, OH

Julie began weaving in 1990 when she enrolled in a basket class. Instantly loving the camaraderie, she began taking every class she could find, reading all the books about baskets in the library and experimenting like crazy. Julie began teaching around the country in 1995 and has formed her company Woven Designs to sell her unique bases and patterns. Julie and her father have designed over 40 bases together. Julie's cousin Debi and Debi's husband Paul make most of the wood tie ons, and Julie's sister Amy cuts many of the kits. Behind the scenes is Julie's husband Art who is the webmaster for Julie's website as well as chief hauler and booth watcher at the conferences.

Nancy Matthews - Clarksville, TN

A professional educator for over 35 years, Nancy's passion is teaching. Her sister taught her to weave baskets, but she was not hooked until she made her first rib basket. She enjoys dying her own reed, weaving all types of rib baskets and designing new variations. For her, the best part is watching students enjoy learning new techniques and creating baskets that make them happy.

Pam Talsky - Waterford, WI

It started with a pine needle basket in June of 1994. Pam has since traveled to Thailand with the Royalwood tour and has made 9 trips to Alaska since 1998, to learn Pine Needle Basketry and Native Haida weaving. She also goes to harvest and prepare her own western red and Alaskan yellow cedar barks and Sitka spruce root. Pam won the AMB Best Coiled for General Membership in 2003, the Teachers awards for both Coiled and Naturals in 2004, for Coiled in 2005, and for both Coiled and Art Piece in 2006. In 2001 she donated 3 weeks and over 200 hours of time to weave a family of willow Tepees for the Ronald McDonald house, which are still used by the kids today.

Marilyn Wald - Riga, MI

Owner of XYZ Basket Works, Marilyn has been weaving since 1988. Marilyn began teaching in 1989 with two students. XYZ Basket Works was formed in 1992. At this time, Marilyn began teaching at conventions, guilds and workshops around the US and Canada. Marilyn has been featured in Basket Bits Magazine and Just Patterns. The students make teaching basketry special for her. It is rewarding seeing the look of a beginner as she or he completes their basket.

Take I-55 south to Exit 160-B, go west on Route 9 (Market Street for 3/4 mile; turn right into the Interstate Center. Park in the rear parking lot; our room is located at the back of the building.

From Western Illinois and Iowa: Take I-80 east to I-74 at Moline, IL. Take I-74 east to I-55, go south to Exit 160-B, go west on Route 9 (Market Street) for 3/4 mile; turn right into the Interstate Center. Park in the rear parking lot; our room is located at the back of the building.

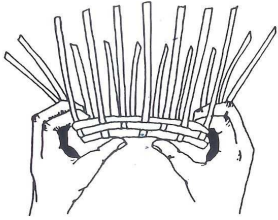


How did Camp Tuck-a-Basket Get It's Name?

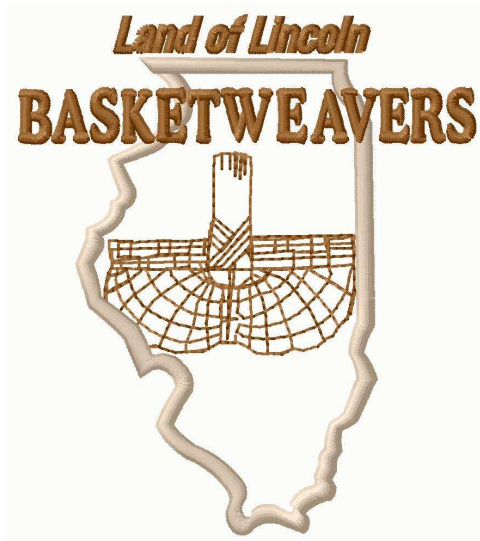
